WORSHIP COVENANT

In order to ensure that worship is a safe space for everyone who wants to return, we ask that you covenant with us to abide by the following safety guidelines:

- » While you may choose to wear a mask, they are no longer required or requested by FCC at this time. We may adjust this decision in the future based on the numbers.
- » Worship leaders, musicians, and speakers are strongly encouraged to be vaccinated.
- » We ask that you wear your name tag or a disposable name tag, available by the front doors.
- » Please maintain a six-foot distance between you and other members at all times when indoors.

- » When you enter, please take a bulletin, then find a spot to sit.
- » The Communion bread and wine are served row by row. Please accept the elements and pass the trays to your neighbor.
- » After the final hymn please make your way outside, taking your bulletin and any trash with you. There will be trash cans by the sanctuary doors

PASTOR'S LETTER

Rev. Patrick Crocker

"To Yahweh belong the earth and all it contains, the world and all who live there;" Psalm 24:1 (NJB)

What seasons of the soul do we feel? How do we respond to the seasons?

At the October farmers' market event for the church, we were approached by a man who asked what our congregation's position on voting was. I responded that we are strongly in favor of it. Since this didn't seem to meet the man's concerns, I further stated that we don't tell people how to vote, but we encourage each person to engage in the life of the community by voting the values held dear. His response was interesting: "If you don't tell people how to vote, they might vote in a way that will make it hard for the church to be *allowed* to gather for worship!" I tilted my head (like a dog trying to understand any English word other than "treat") and he went on his way. And I still don't know which way he was hoping I'd tell everyone to vote.

Having had some time to reflect on the encounter (and recognizing that by the time these words are read, we will be closer to knowing the results of such a fraught election), I can respond with a bit more breath, intention and, hopefully, wisdom.

I prefer to talk about values rather than parties because parties and individual politicians can change minds and positions. (And I have to applaud people who change their minds when they are presented with new information.) I also prefer to talk about how to think, rather than what to think. There's also the fact that I prefer to trust that when we affirm our values as a faith community, we are intelligent enough to then choose leaders who live out those values.

I admit that it can be difficult to have enough information to make good decisions (and that we must first have enough information to discern good sources of information). There are also times when leaders who were chosen in good faith make poor decisions.

Regardless of how voting night turns out (and how long it takes for it to turn out), there will be joy, grief, satisfaction, disappointment, hope, and fear in our communities. It is our call as members of a community of faith, and perhaps more importantly as members of a community of *faithfulness*, to pray and work for frustration and grief

to be expressed creatively rather than violently, for a clean heart to be recreated within the soul of all peoples, for us to work toward putting the "unity" back into "community." Voting our values is important; of greater importance is living our values.

"[W]hile we are alive, we are living for the Lord, and when we die, we die for the Lord: and so, alive or dead, we belong to the Lord." Romans 14:8 (NJB)
