# WORSHIP COVENANT

In order to ensure that worship is a safe space for everyone who wants to return, we ask that you covenant with us to abide by the following safety guidelines:

- » While you may choose to wear a mask, they are no longer required or requested by FCC at this time. We may adjust this decision in the future based on the numbers.
- » Worship leaders, musicians, and speakers are strongly encouraged to be vaccinated.
- » We ask that you wear your name tag or a disposable name tag, available by the front doors.
- » Please maintain a six-foot distance between you and other members at all times when indoors.

- » When you enter, please take a bulletin, then find a spot to sit.
- » The Communion bread and wine are served row by row. Please accept the elements and pass the trays to your neighbor.
- » After the final hymn please make your way outside, taking your bulletin and any trash with you. There will be trash cans by the sanctuary doors

# PASTOR'S LETTER

# Rev. Patrick Crocker

"As you walk the road with me, you are a light shining in this dark world. A village built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one hides a torch under a basket. Instead it is lifted up high on a pole, so all who are in the house can see it. In the same way, let your light shine by doing what is good and right. When others see, they will give honor to your Father—the One Above Us All." – Matthew 5:14-16, FNV

How do we search for light? How do we bless the light we have found?

A recent episode of "Patrick's ADD takes him down a research rabbit-hole" featured curiosity about the holiday of Candlemas. I knew it was listed for February 2, along with a number of other holidays, and presumed it had something to do with candles.

My procrastinator and punk selves both found delight in discovering that Candlemas marks the end of the Christmas-Epiphany season for a number of faith communities. Since it is 40 days after Christmas, it marks a special time and also celebrates the presentation of the Christ child in the temple and the ritual purification of Mary. (Several ancient cultures noted the holiness of giving birth and required those involved to have some time apart before rejoining the rest of society. The custom may have also been influenced by men who got grossed-out and new mothers who really needed some rest.)

Communities that don't allow themselves to decorate for Christmas until December 24th finally put away the greenery and ribbons on February 2. In some countries, people watch for whether bears see their shadows (think of the groundhog Punxsutawney Phil, but super-sized). Others focus on enjoying crepes or tamales. It's one of the liminal days, noting the end of what was and the beginning of something else.

Many churches bless candles on this day, reminding us all that we are cooperating as the family of faith in being a Light to the Cosmos. Perhaps I am not called to be the particular lamp to guide a weary traveler back home, but my hopes and prayers for both the Light and the Lost help the entirety of the World. Perhaps I am called to be a lantern, but I rely on the flame nurtured in the Community Which Came Before me to spark the light. Perhaps the light itself is less important than that which is illumined: a place of welcome, a place of safety, a place we dare to call home.

"Creator's life shined out from the Word, giving light to all human beings. This is the true Light that comes to all the peoples of the world and shines on everyone. The Light shines into the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it or put it out." – John 1:4-5, FNV
